The group discussed that the following framework could be used as a guideline for faculty for the design of an online course or the evaluation of an online course.

Learning Activities	Develop activities that foster student collaboration and interaction
Structure & Interface	User-friendly course structure & interface Easy navigation Coherent Module/weekly/topic
Assessment	Rubrics Alternative forms of assessment Formative assessment Clear grade distribution/scheme
Technology	Technologies that address Different learning styles Technologies that promote interaction High quality multimedia (videos, images..) Interoperable
Delivery	Teacher's/tutor's presence (feedback, responding to students, video conference) Course adjustment/enhancement
Accessibility	The group discussed that accessibility could be an option. If we include it in the framework there might be a chance that a course would not pass if it was not accessible.
